PRE-COLUMBIAN HISTORY

Permanent Archaeology Exhibition

This room is a chronological tour starting at the arrival of the first settler to our country, approximately 13000 years ago, until the contact with the Spanish in the 16th century. You may observe objects elaborated with clay, stone, gold, jade and bone; they show the social-political, economic and religious changes experienced by pre-Columbian societies.

The Museum gardens represent the diversity of ecosystems of the Central Valley.






TEMPORARY EXHIBITIONS

Jail Cells






